

A Quick Reference Guide to Nurse Prescribing

Introduction

The rules for nurse prescribing have changed quite considerably over the past few years. This quick reference guide has been prepared to explain the current rules for each type of nurse prescriber in each country and how to set them up within **Vision 3**.

Types of Nurse Prescriber

There are three different types of nurse prescriber that can be set up within **Vision 3**:

- Community Practitioner Nurse Prescriber This covers any nursing staff that can prescribe from the restricted Nurses Formulary only. See Setting up a Community Practitioner Nurse Prescriber on page 2.
- Nurse Supplementary Prescriber Nurse Supplementary Prescribers can prescribe any licensed medicine for a patient, within an agreed Clinical Management Plan. The Clinical Management Plan must be agreed with a doctor. See Setting up a Nurse Supplementary Prescriber on page 3.
- Nurse Independent Prescriber Nurse Independent Prescribers can prescribe any licensed medicine for any medical condition within their competence. See Setting up a Nurse Independent Prescriber on page 4.

Setting up a Community Practitioner Nurse Prescriber

Note - You must be logged in with system administrator rights to update a member of staff.

To set up a Community Practitioner Nurse Prescriber within Vision 3:

1. From Management Tools - Control Panel - File Maintenance, select the nurse you are allocating prescriber rights to.

Nurse Prescribing - England

The **Prescribing Numbers** for nurses in England are made up of nnannna where n = numeric and a = alphabetic. These are allocated by Prescription Services, and can be obtained from your health authority.

Nurse Prescribing - Scotland

The **Prescribing Numbers** for nurses in Scotland are made up of aaaaa where a = alphabetic digits. The first digit is the Health Board cipher, the second and third are a unique identifier for the nurse concerned and the final two digits identify the practice. These numbers can be obtained from your Health Board.

The **Prescribing Numbers** for nurses in Wales are made up of annnnn where a = alphabetic and n = numeric. These are allocated by Digital Health and Care Wales (DHCW).

Prescriptions issued by Nurse Prescribers are printed on following forms for easy identification:

- Community Practitioner Nurse Prescriber WP10PN
- Nurse Supplementary Prescriber WP10SPSS
- Nurse Independent Prescriber WP10IPSS
