Urgent Medicines Supply CPCS Referrals

The following changes have been made to **Urgent Medicines Supply CPCS Referrals**:

- Urgent Medicines Supply Referral Controlled Drugs You can now identify Controlled Drugs by a coloured label:
 - <u>Schedule 1, 2 & 3 Controlled Drugs now display a red label</u>



If a referral is not accepted by a GP practice, an email is now sent to your store advising a GP Notification has been rejected by a patient's GP practice:
