Summary of Changes

Vision Anywhere release 4.7 contains the following new features and improvements:

Note - For full **Vision Anywhere** release **4.7** functionality you must have **Vision 3** release **DLM 830**.

All Countries

- Encounter Type:
 - Medication Management Event To support Medication Reviews, we have introduced a new Encounter Type of Medication Management Event.

Note - Only available once the relevant SNOMED CT subset is released.

- Non-consultation medication data To support the expansion of repeat medication management, we have introduced a new **Encounter Type** of **Non-consultation medication data**. This cannot be selected manually, it is automatically allocated to the reauthorisation of and the issuing from existing Repeat Masters.
- **Sodium Valproate Warning** The Sodium Valproate Warning now only displays on patients who are female and aged 12 55.
- Schedule 4 and 5 Controlled Drugs The issue relating to the missing indicator when prescribing Schedule 4 and 5 Controlled Drugs has been addressed.

Welsh GP Portal (WGPP)

Digital Health and Care Wales (DHCW) has consolidated many of its services into a single portal for ease of access and use. To facilitate this you can now access the **Welsh GP Portal (WGPP)** from within **Vision Anywhere** quickly and seamlessly. The first service to use this feature is test requesting.

From the **WGPP** you can:

- Request tests for a patient, see WGPP Test Requesting on page 5 for details.
- Display tests requested for a specific patient, see Viewing WGPP Test Requests on page 10 for details.
- Reprint WGPP test request labels, see Reprinting WGPP Test Request Labels on page 11 for details.

WGPP Test Requesting

To access the **WGPP** and request a test:

- 1. From Vision Anywhere, select the patient required in the usual way.
- 2. From Navigation bar, select Application Switch
- 3. Select External Services GP Portal:



Note - Applications available vary depending on your system set up.

Training Tip - If you select **External Services - GP Portal** without first selecting a patient you are prompted to select a patient.

4. If requested, enter your log in details and select **OK**.

Training Tip - Your log in criteria are the same for both the **WCCG** and the **WGPP**.



GPTR Requesting

- 5. The WGPP displays, select GPTR Requesting
- 6. The Welcome to the GP Test Requesting Application screen displays, complete the test request as per instruction provided by Digital Health and Care Wales (DHCW).





- 7. Once all the details of your request are complete, select **Request**Request
- 8. The **Print Labels for Test Request** screen displays offering you a choice of writeback options to enable you to write the information back to **Vision Anywhere** in a way to best fit your practice protocols:

- 9. From **Printer**, select the printer you require and in **Type** the style of your labels, **A5** or **Zebra**.
- 10. Finally, select **Print** to print the test request labels.
